

- What is EPR
  - EPR is an environmental policy approach that makes producers responsible for the entire lifecycle of the products they
    place on the market, including product design, importing, selling, take-back, and final disposal.
  - The goal is to incentivize producers to consider the environmental impacts of their products at every stage, including designing for better recyclability and reducing waste and resource consumption.
- Who must comply?
  - PRODUCERS: A producer is defined as the entity that first markets a product subject to EPR in a country.







- Risks of non-compliance:
  - Fines, income confiscated, product seizure, store fronts shut down.








**EMEA** and **EPR**




Uyghur Forced **Labour Prevention** Act, 2023



Trafficking Victims Protections

Reauthorization Act





Creates a rebuttable position that all goods from Xinjiang are made with slave labor

To date > 10,000 shipments valued at \$3.6Bn have been detained

Prohibits goods made with forced labor

Addresses labor trafficking

Contains anti-trafficking provisions for government contractors

Requires reporting on modern slavery risks and actions

Requires large companies to identify and address human rights abuses in their value chains

- Bans products made with forced labor from the **EU Market**
- Like UFLPA but more strict
- Requires businesses to report on steps taken to address modern slavery risks
- Mandates human rights due diligence for large companies
- Requires large companies to identify and prevent human rights violations
